Presentation with Burcu Eke-Schneider (University of Wuppertal)

An intercultural "Peace Garden" was created in order to live and learn inclusion, build awareness for women's empowerment, implement peacebuilding strategies, contribute to more climate justice and learn about biodiversity on a micro and local level to reduce the power of the drivers of injustice in the context of sustainable urban development. It is located at the Alevi Culture Centre Wuppertal where is a space genuinely dedicated to persons with a specific Alevi migration background, of religious activity of the Alevi culture. In this location a group was formed consisting of community, locals and other international participants. It resulted as an alternative eco-education model: 'out of school space' for intercultural and interreligious dialogue in the nature during the transformation process.

The workshop will present the CITIZED project, co-funded by the European Union, whose final objective is to develop an innovative set of instruments that will help the widespread implementation of citizenship education policies in European education systems. The workshop will be structured in three parts: a first one focuses on some of the key challenges to Citizenship Education identified during the early project implementation phase; a second part will stimulate a debate on teachers' competences frameworks; a final part consisting in developing an "ideas forum" aimed at discussing participants' inputs and suggestions as well as possible future opportunities of cooperation.

Creative games and artistic encounters help us look differently at the complexities of current issues by disturbing rigid thinking and unsettling prejudice. Arts can be an entry point to citizenship, inviting learners to read, critically, the world around them, not just from the written word. Art affects us intellectually and emotionally and can help us: practise 'listening as a condition of vision'; discover deeper questions to be asked...and move towards social action. This Pecha Kucha will explore CANDIICE's conceptual approaches and questions, supporting CoE Competences for Democratic Citizenship. We invite educators (formal and informal) artists and creative workers to share this exploration



Invisible Migrant-Workers and Visible Human Rights. Social solidarity in Europe

Presentation with Prof. Inocent Szaniszló (Pontifical University of Saint Thomas Aquinas Rome)

Migrant workers are part of the everyday economic life of Europe. Today we find Ukrainian agricultural workers in Spain, Romanian workers in German meat factories, and Slovakian, Czech and Hungarian geriatric nurses assisting Austrian families – to name a few. Usually these workers are "invisible." Many of them are exploited both socially and economically. During their time of employment, they live in poverty level accommodations. Employee rights, such as hours or work breaks, have been ignored. During this time of COVID crisis these invisible migrant workers have become visible. The lines of exploitation often run between Western and Eastern Europe; but also occur between EU and non-EU states. In order to uphold the dignity of the human person with humane conditions for migrant



workers, the Church can advocate in the following ways:

- 1) To evaluate and critique legal or illegal existing conditions
- 2) To raise public awareness of the fate of migrant workers
- 3) To help with concrete proposals for improving the situation in the sense of a new social solidarity in Europe.

Cohesion in your region (CORE) with Mareike Meyer (EuroSoc-digital gGmbH)

The CORE project brings the EU's Cohesion policy to schools and contributes to young Europeans' awareness on the impact the EU Cohesion policy has on our everyday lives. During project days in schools, youngsters develop an own project idea for their home region that could be supported by the Cohesion policy with the help of a future lab.

KARIJEROTEKA – your first link with the world of work with Vera Pfaff (Zaklada Znanje na djelu/ Stiftung Wissen am Werk)

KARIJEROTEKA online conversations engage young people into exploring careers in Croatia. The program addresses students from 8th grade (elementary school) and 1st – 4th grade (high school) and inspires them to find out about exciting jobs through talking to those who do them. ZND has, so far, enabled more than 3000 young people to visit companies and institutions and to meet fascinating people, offline and online, in many different professions in order to boost knowledge and awareness about career paths in Croatia. In the season 2021/2022 KARIJEROTEKA will present different career opportunities that evolve around the term green economy. Kids will learn what green economy is and, more importantly, why it is an essential part of their future job and their future in general.

The program brings scientist and activists, entrepreneurs and managers, developers and farmers that deal with sustainable growth, ecology, renewable energy and waste management. KARIJEROTEKA will again show young people a whole variety of sectors and positions that deal with these issues.

Kids will engage in conversations and hear answers to questions like: 'What's the most interesting aspect of your work? What did your career path look like? What skills are essential in your position? What advice would you give your 16-year-old self today?'

MAKE EUROPE GREAT AGAIN – Educating about Europe with Mathieu Decq (Director, Pistes Solidaires) & Martina Massoli (Project manager, Pistes Solidaires)

All the studies and surveys confirm that Europe remains abstract and unknown to young people. According to the Eurobarometer n°455: – 89% of young people want national governments to provide better education about European Union ;

– 80% want this education to become a component of compulsory education.

Informing more and informing better appears to be a line of work that should be carried out in the school context.

With the Erasmus+ “Make Europe Great Again” (MEGA) project, 6 European partners will reach together one main objective: facilitate, support and reinforce learning about European Union at school by equipping teachers with appropriate teaching methods and resources.

PRO-YOUTH: project-based training for youth in heritage tourism with Dunja Vuković (Zaklada Znanje na djelu / Stiftug Wissen am Werk)

PRO-YOUTH offer a solution for the unemployment of the young, the lack of qualified personnel in the field of cultural tourism, and possibilities for sustainable development of local communities. Through Pro-Youth training, we tested the methodological framework, educational modules and manual. Based on the experience from the training and research that preceded the development of the methodology, recommendations for public policies

regarding cultural tourism were made. Project was realized under Erasmus+ partnership.

The Conference on the future of Europe aims to provide an opportunity for such participation and could serve as a milestone towards developing new forms of participation or reform of existing methods. In order for citizens to actively participate it is however necessary to enhance citizenship competences in the EU and get a better understanding of citizens' current abilities to engage with decision-making. While various studies and monitorings by Eurydice, the Council of Europe and International Association for the Evaluation of Educational Achievement exist, developing a more frequent monitoring and comprehensive evaluation indicators for all the EU-27 has the potential to inform greater efforts at EU and national level to enhance citizenship competences.




